DURING FISCAL YEAR 2014, Gift of Adoption hosted the 3rd Annual Domestic Fund event – a donor-designated fund created for the sole purpose of helping vulnerable children in the United States become a part of a family.

Additionally, Gift of Adoption chapters opened in Texas and Connecticut, becoming the organization's 9th and 10th chapters.

Gift of Adoption also began testing zero interest loans as an additional program offering. In fiscal year 2014, five loans were issued to complete the adoptions of six additional children. All loans were funded by restricted gifts to a designated loan fund.


