



As of July, 2019, 60% of Adoption Capital Region's has awarded **\$258,800** in adoption assistance grants across the Capital Region to complete the adoptions of **84 children**.

**Chapter Goal**

Each year 10% of Adoption Capital Region's income comes from approximately 100 awarded families – representing a funding pool of \$258,800. The goal of the Capital Region Chapter is to ensure that we are able enough funds to help complete each of these adoptions. 10% of the money used by the Chapter is directed to working children with foster families in the state.



**Mission**

10% of Adoption Capital Region's income funds assistance grants to complete the adoptions of adoptable children – giving them a permanent family and the chance to thrive.



**Priority**

Money is spent on helping children facing what's possibly their only chance at adoption, including children with or without their siblings or siblings/parents who, upon exit of the placement or with certain medical conditions. Our grants are spent without regard to race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or gender identity and are paid directly to agencies and attorneys working on the child's behalf.



**History**

10% of Adoption was funded in 1991 by adoption agency fees and was a pilot of Greater Broward. Due to expanding demand for adoption assistance grants, the Florida Commissioner for Children and Youth Services transferred it to a public entity in 2011.

**Statistical Impact**

Each recipient, 60% has needed this money to complete the adoptions of 1,175 children. Because we spend more money upon older or older at-risk children you're just as important as making a difference in the life of a child today!
