



As of July 2019, COPI of Adoption Colorado has awarded **\$249,500** in adoption assistance grants across Colorado to complete the adoptions of **69 children**.

Chapter Goal

Each year 100 of adoptive Colorado residents request for approximately 100 qualified families – representing a funding need of **\$100,000**. The goal of this Colorado Chapter of COPI is to use thoughtful funding supports with diverse adoptions. 100% of the money awarded by this Chapter is shared to working children with foster families in the state.



Mission

COPI of Adoption Colorado is a national leader that uses family-reusable grants to complete the adoptions of adoptable children – giving them a permanent family and the chance to thrive.



Priority

Priority is placed on helping children facing unique priority, that only arises at adoption, including children with or suspected from siblings with long-term care, coping with an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. Our grants are given without regard to race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or marital status and are paid directly to agencies and adoptive families on the child's behalf.

Eligibility

Only U.S. citizens adopting from anywhere in the world (domestic or international) who has an approved home study for adoption is eligible. Financial need must be demonstrated.



History

COPI of Adoption was founded in 1999 by adoption parents Gene and Joyce White of Golden, Colorado. Due to overwhelming demand for adoption assistance grants, the White couple created the national nonprofit organization, COPI, as a public charity in 2001.

National Impact

Since inception, COPI has awarded 10.5 million to complete the adoptions of 1,175 children. Because no single state agency could afford to do so on their own, they got to work on making a difference on behalf of a child today.
