Founded in 2016

As of July, 2019, Gift of Adoption has awarded \$282,500 in adoption assistance grants across Michigan to complete the adoptions of 100 children.



Chapter Goal

Each year, Gift of Adoption Michigan receives requests from approximately 14 qualified families - representing a funding need of \$56,000. The goal of the MIchigan Chapter's allvolunteer board is to raise enough funds to help complete each of these adoptions. 100% of the money raised by the chapter is directed to uniting children with forever families in the area.



Mission

Gift of Adoption (GOA) is a national charity that raises funds to provide grants to complete the adoptions of vulnerable children – giving them a permanent family and the chance to thrive.






Priority is placed on helping children facing what is possibly their only chance at adoption, including children at-risk of separation from siblings, entering foster care, aging-out of an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. Our grants are given without regard to age, race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or marital status and are paid directly to agencies and attorneys working on the child's behalf.

Eligibility

Any U.S. citizen adopting from anywhere in the world (domestic or international) who has an approved home study is eligible to apply. Financial need must be demonstrated.
