

As of July 2019, CFC of Adoption has awarded **\$203,000** in adoption assistance grants across Nebraska and Iowa to complete the adoptions of **78** children.



Chapter Goal

Each year 10% of adoptions in Nebraska and Iowa receive requests from applicants for qualified families – representing a funding need of **\$203,000**. The goal of the Nebraska Adoption Chapter is to ensure that there are able adoptive families to help complete each of these adoptions. 100% of the money awarded by the Chapter is shared in making children with foster families in Nevada.



Mission

10% of adoptions in Nebraska and Iowa receive requests from applicants for qualified families – representing a funding need of **\$203,000**. The goal of the Nebraska Adoption Chapter is to ensure that there are able adoptive families to help complete each of these adoptions.



Priority

Priority is placed on helping children facing what's possibly their only chance at adoption, including children with or separation from siblings or siblings/parents, coping with an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. Our grants are given without regard to race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or marital status and are paid directly to agencies and adoptive families on the child's behalf.



History

10% of Adoption was funded by 1996 by adoption parents from and Governor of Gordon Strickland. Due to overwhelming demand for adoption assistance grants, the Rights Commission for Adoption was established to administer a public market in 2011.

National Impact

Since inception, CFC has awarded \$2.2 million to complete the adoptions of 1,175 children. Because we create viable adoptive families at risk of being lost, we have you to join us in making a difference in the life of a child today!
