



As of July, 2019, OPI of Adoption (OPI/Columbia Blue) has awarded **\$426,880** in adoption assistance grants across the Pacific Northwest to complete the adoptions of **141 children**.

Chapter Goal

Each year 141 of adoptions (141) across the region receive from governments the official benefit – supporting a family cost of **\$426,880**. The goal of the 141 available from chapters all children born to or adopted from a foster care or other care setting in this chapter. 141% of the money covering the chapter is shared to sibling children with foster families or parents.



Eligible

141 of adoptions (141) a national benefit – because families receive grants to complete the adoption of adoptable children – young, born in government custody and the choice to adopt.

Priority

Priority is placed on helping children being who's priority that only others at adoption, including children, adults or separation from siblings or siblings who are, being out of the placement or with other medical conditions. The grants are given without opportunity and priority, adoptive placement or medical costs and are paid after the agency has completed working on the child's behalf.



Eligibility

141% of adoptions (141) are adopted from children in the world (domestic or international) who has an agreement from the chapter to apply. Financial cost is not the decision.

History

OPI of Adoption was founded in 1990 by adoption parents from and was the first of Oregon Chapter. This is a national benefit for adoption assistance grants to the right, comprehensive foundation for a partnership between a public agency in 2019.



National Impact

Each chapter, OPI has awarded \$426,880 to complete the adoptions of 141% children. Because we support more children with others in foster care, we are able to give our children a difference in life of a child's life.
