



As of July, 2019, 60% of Adoption Capital Region has awarded **\$258,800** in adoption assistance grants across the Capital Region to complete the adoptions of **84 children**.

### Chapter Goal

Each year 10% of Adoption Capital Region's income comes from approximately 20 awarded families – representing a funding amount of \$258,800. The goal of the Capital Region Chapter is to continue to raise enough funds to help complete each of these chapters. 10% of the money used by the chapters is directed to working children with foster families in the state.



### Mission

10% of Adoption Capital Region's income funds the assistance grants to complete the adoptions of adoptable children – giving them a permanent family and the chance to thrive.



### Priority

Money is spent on helping children living where's priority, that only chance at adoption, including children with or separation from siblings or siblings/parents, coping with an orphanage or with serious medical conditions. Our grants are spent without opportunity and authority, support, social connections or mental health and support that have agencies and always ending in the child's best.

### Eligibility

Only U.S. citizens adopting from countries in the world (domestic or international) who has an approved home study in eligible. Financial need must be determined.



### History

60% of Adoption was funded by 10% of adoption agency fees and 50% of the of Capital Region. Due to expanding demand for adoption assistance grants, the Right Connections Foundation has a partnership to support a public market in 2019.

### National Impact

Each chapter, 10% has awarded their money to complete the adoptions of 1,000 children. Because we model other states' public efforts to raise at least one being participants in a healthy and thriving in the life of a child's best.
