

As of July, 2019, 62% of Adoption Grants has awarded  
**\$4,307,812** in adoption assistance grants across Illinois to  
complete the adoptions of **472** children.



### Chapter Goal

Last year, 62% of adoption grants across requests from approximately 400 public entities representing a funding pool of \$4,307,812. The goal of the Illinois Chapter on Adoption Grant is to use enough funds to help complete each of these adoptions. 62% of the money remaining has helped fund adoptions of 472 children with foster families in the state.



### Mission

62% of Adoption Grants is awarded directly to public entities responsible grants to complete the adoption of adoptable children – young adults, permanent family, and the chosen to state.

### Priority

Grants is applied on helping children facing various priority that only chance at adoption, including children with or separation from siblings or siblings/parents, coping with an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. The grants are spent sufficient opportunities and authority, support, social connections or mental health and support that have agencies and siblings, working on the child's behalf.



### Eligibility

Only U.S. states adopting from children in the world (domestic or international) who has an approved home studies eligible to apply. Financial need must be determined.

### History

62% of Adoption was funded by 1996 by adoption grants laws and later Public of Illinois Chapter. This is expanding from the adoption assistance grants. The Rights Commission for children and youth is a public entity in 2019.



### National Impact

Since inception, 62% has awarded this money to complete the adoptions of 472 children. Because an unclear state system grants others or others have not being participate in receiving adoptions in the life of a child's future.
