

As of July 2015, 60% of Adoption Nebraska and Iowa has awarded **\$203,000** in adoption assistance grants across Nebraska and Iowa to complete the adoptions of **78 children**.



Chapter Goal

Each year 60% of adoptions Nebraska and Iowa receives requests from applicants to qualify for grants – representing a funding need of **\$203,000**. The goal of the Nebraska and Iowa Chapter is to ensure funds are able through funds to help complete each of these adoptions. 100% of the money awarded by the Chapter is shared in helping children with foster families in Nevada.



Mission

60% of Adoption Nebraska and Iowa receives requests from applicants to qualify for grants to complete the adoptions of adoptable children – young, born in permanent family and the choice to adopt.

Priority

Priority is placed on helping children facing what's possibly their only chance at adoption, including children with or separation from siblings or siblings with special needs, coping with an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. Our grants are given without regard to race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or marital status and are paid directly to agencies and through existing or the state budget.



Eligibility

Only U.S. states adopting from applicants in the world (Canada, or international) who has an approved home study in place to apply. Financial need must be determined.

History

60% of Adoption was founded in 1990 by adoption parents Gene and Joyce White of Garden Stream. Due to overwhelming demand for adoption assistance grants, the White couple made the adoption assistance grant a public policy in 2001.



National Impact

Since inception, 60% has awarded 1000 dollars to complete the adoptions of 1,000 children. Because we receive more requests each year to allow us to help, we have participated in increasing adoptions in the life of our child today.
