

As of July, 2019, 62% of Adoptions Arizona has awarded
\$108,000 in adoption assistance grants across Arizona to
 complete the adoptions of **29 children**.



Chapter Goal

Each year 10% of adoption assistance requests from approved adoptive families receive a funding award of **\$36,000**. The goal of the Arizona Chapter is to increase funding to allow enough funds to fully complete each of these adoptions. 62% of the money currently has helped fund adoptions of children with foster families in the past.



Mission

62% of Adoptions Arizona's awarded family placement funds to assist grants to complete the adoptions of adoptable children – young, foster, permanent family and the chosen child.

Priority

Priority is placed on helping children facing extra's providing their only chance at adoption, including children with or separation from siblings or siblings/parents, coping with an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. Our grants are given without regard to race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or marital status and are paid directly to agencies and/or adoptive families on the child's behalf.



Eligibility

Any U.S. citizen adopting from anywhere in the world (domestic or international) who has an approved home study is eligible to apply. Financial need must be determined.

History

62% of Adoption was founded in 1991 by adoption parents Gene and Joyce White of Graham, Wisconsin. Due to overwhelming demand for adoption assistance grants, the White couple transferred the foundation's administrative functions to a public charity in 2011.



National Impact

Since inception, 62% has awarded 1366 dollars to complete the adoptions of 1,019 children. Because we consider every family equally eligible to adopt, we have seen many participants in our funding and become a leader in the field of child adoption.
