

As of June 30, 2023, CCR of Adoption Massachusetts has awarded **\$771,000** in adoption assistance grants across Massachusetts to complete the adoptions of **24 children**.



Chapter Goal

Last year 100% of adoptive Massachusetts families received from approximately 18 qualified families – representing a funding total of **\$668,000**. The goal of the Massachusetts Department of Communities is to ensure adoptive families complete each of these adoptions. 100% of the money covering this chapter is allocated to funding children and foster families in the state.



Mission

CCR of Adoption fulfills a national family formation best practice goal to complete the adoptions of adoptable children – giving them a permanent family and the chance to thrive.



Priority

Family support for helping children facing what's possibly their only chance at adoption, including children with or separated from siblings or siblings with care, coping with an orphanage or with critical medical conditions. Our grants are given without regard to race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or gender identity and are paid directly to agencies and adoptive families in the state budget.

Eligibility

Only U.S. citizens adopting from outside the United States, or international adoptions, are approved under federal adoption law. Financial need must be demonstrated.



History

CCR of Adoption was founded in 1991 by adoption pioneer Gene and Lucie White of Greater Boston. Due to overwhelming demand for adoption assistance grants, the White couple transferred the organization's administrative functions to a public charity in 2016.

National Impact

Over the past 30 years, CCR has awarded 1,000 dollars to complete the adoptions of 1,000 children. Because we consider every family equally eligible to adopt at-risk and being particularly vulnerable children, we have the ability to fund a wide range of
