Adoption Matters: It Changes and Saves Lives

Every child deserves a loving family. Yet more than 153 million children are growing up in orphanages, on the streets or in foster care, including 400,000 in the United States. Unadopted children often suffer poor life outcomes, including homelessness, lack of employment options and early pregnancies. Overseas, unadopted children have a dramatically increased propensity to become victims of crime, trafficking, substance abuse and suicide. The probability of being adopted internationally is only 1.5%, and more than 23,000 children in the U.S. age out of foster care each year without a family. Adoption can prevent these tragic outcomes, as families provide the protection, nurturing love and foundation for a child to not only survive some of life’s most difficult circumstances, but also to thrive. About the Children We Serve

Priority is placed on helping children facing what is possibly their only chance at adoption, including children at risk of separation from siblings, entering foster care, aging-out of an orphanage or with special needs. Children assisted through Gift of Adoption grants are adopted both domestically and internationally.

Who Are Our Grant Families

Many Americans seriously consider adoption, yet only 1% complete the process. Most often, the cost of adoption is cited as the barrier to moving forward. (Source: Dave Thomas Foundation.) Families served by Gift of Adoption are often led by educators, those who serve in medical fields or the military, and small business owners. These prospective parents have an average household income of \$50,000 and yearn for the chance to create or add to their families through adoption. Often, families encounter unanticipated expenses or timing challenges that lead to financial hurdles, like a match that happens very quickly or a delay due to NICU hospitalization. These additional challenges can put the adoption completion in jeopardy, potentially leaving a child in a foster home or waiting even longer to come home.

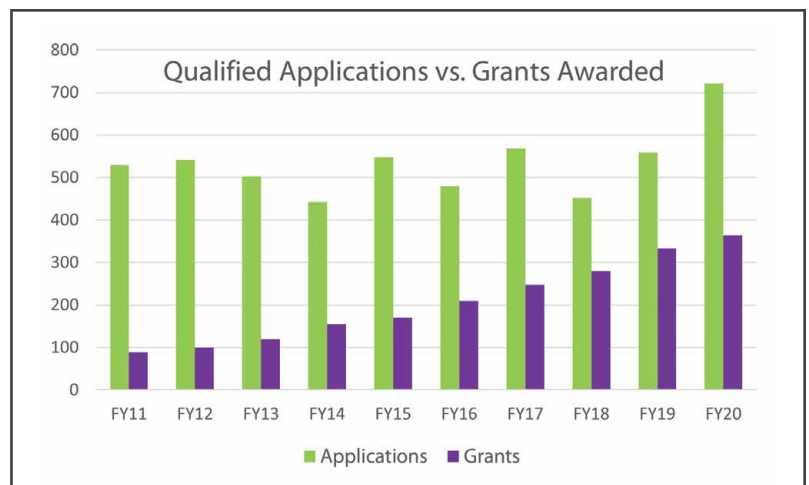

The Need Has Grown

The number of children without families has increased both internationally and in the U.S. Costs to adopt have also increased over the past ten years, with a domestic adoption now averaging 26% more than in 2010. Total expenses now range from \$35,000 to \$55,000 per adoption. International adoptions are taking longer than ever--up to three years. In the U.S., more than 250,000 children have been placed in foster care in each of the last five reported years, with more than 100,000 children waiting to be adopted at any given time (Source: AFCARS). The good news is that as many as 25% of American families seriously consider adoption as a way to build their own families. Accordingly, applications for Gift of Adoption grants were up 29% in 2020*, yet currently we can provide this essential funding to just 2/3 of qualified applicants.



Gift of Adoption Impact

Gift of Adoption relies solely on the generosity of donors to fulfill our mission, with no state or federal funding to supplement these efforts. With a small staff and hundreds of volunteers across the U.S., we are a high impact organization with intentional growth strategies that have doubled our capacity for grants over the last five years. As of December 2020, as we move into our 25th year, more than \$10.6 million in adoption grants have been awarded, providing forever families for 3,637 children. We are the oldest and largest provider of grants awarded on a nondiscriminatory basis, a trusted partner in the adoption community and a highly credentialed nonprofit.

We know that the need for adoption grants is growing faster than our ability to fund these requests. So, we are launching this 25th Anniversary Campaign and seeking campaign funding of \$1 million - to help unite 525 children with their permanent families during 2021, a 12% increase over FY20.

Donors to the campaign have the opportunity to choose where they'd like to have the greatest impact – by directing their gift toward grants to prospective families or by leveraging their gift organizationally to create programs and donor opportunities that will grow the organization to new heights and sustain the mission over the long run.

Grants to Families to Bring Children Home

The aspirational goal of uniting 525 children with families represents the most grants awarded in the organization's history. Yet we know that children are waiting -- and removing financial barriers to adoption is the most cost-effective and direct way to ensure more children are adopted. Through this campaign we offer the meaningful opportunity for donors to direct their gifts to completing adoption grants that bring children home.

Capacity Building Through Development Initiatives

Our capacity to award grants is limited by the amount raised each year. We are shifting resources to expand beyond fundraising events, working hand in hand with our Chapter leaders to engage family foundations, corporations, community groups and individuals who believe that having a loving family is a basic right for children everywhere. Through new, strategic development efforts, supported by this fundraising campaign, we will drive the organizational capacity to be able to unite 750 children with families by 2025.

Endowing an Adoption Grant

Donors are invited to make a lasting impact by creating an endowed fund in their own name or in the name of a loved one. The principle gift, which will be held in perpetuity, ensures Gift of Adoption's ability to deliver our mission no matter the hurdles and economic conditions faced. Each year, earned interest income will be directed to complete an adoption grant in an area that is meaningful for the donor and his/her family for generations to come.
