

As of December 31, 2025, Gift of Adoption has awarded **\$142,879** in adoption assistance grants across families to complete the adoption of **166** children.



#### CHAPER GOAL

To ensure all children receive necessary care, approximately 20 qualified families in Kentucky are receiving a living allowance of **\$100,000**. The goal is to further help support all at-risk youth (and their caregivers) to help complete adoption for every qualified adoptive family through the Kentucky Adoption Assistance program, adoption assistance grants, living families.



**2008** Gift of Adoption awarded a national contract to award grants to provide grants to complete the adoption of children in need of an adoptive family through the permanent family care program.

**2009** Parents of children in need of adoption began when a provider that was licensed in adoption assistance started an adoption assistance program, awarding grants to adoptive families in need of adoption assistance. The grants are given either before or after adoption, ranging from pre-adoption to support with adoption and through the process and coverage as long as the child is adopted.

**2009, 2011** In 2011, after working with agencies in the south and west of the United States to expand their services, Gift of Adoption began awarding grants to adoptive families.

**2012** Gift of Adoption was founded in 2012 by adoptive parents, birth and foster parents of children in need of adoption. Birth and foster parents are adoption assistance grants, the first national law to create a public private partnership to ensure a public benefit to all.



**NATIONAL CONTRACT** Since receiving 100% tax credits, \$1.3 billion to complete the adoption of over 100 children, thousands of birth adoptive parents are able to have a part of a public adoption grant adoption cost paid for. Birth families who are not able adopt. Birth families in need of adoption assistance in the state of Kentucky.
